Ideas and Suggestions

Sometimes expectations are too high, especially for children who struggle.

I would like to see more PTFA events, which at the moment are repetitive.

Sports Day could be more of an event, with more of the traditional races (i.e. 3-legged, egg and spoon) I would like a better understanding of the rewards system.

Please can homework be put into books and not on noticeboards on windows; some parents do not pick up from school.

If teachers suggest they will implement something to support a child then please make sure it is done.

More frequent informal updates on progress would be beneficial – maybe in a student diary.

Could the P.T.F.A. try some new fundraising ideas and ask for help for events with more notice?

I wish there wasn't quite as much homework.

I think there should be more homework.

I am a trained fitness instructor and could offer Zumba kids clubs or any other fitness activities.

Could we have a greater range of after-school activities? Can the school recommend books that parents can buy to help children with difficult subjects?

I would like to know when the children are completing the longer running races (part of Sports Day) so that I/parents could attend.

I would like to know more about playtimes and lunchtimes and who is looking after the children. Parents' information evenings would be useful so that parents can understand the expectations of each year group.

Could the report summary be sent home before Parents' Evening so that the teacher knows of any issues to be discussed at the meeting?
